SPEED CONTROL POLICY TASK FORCE  
MAY 22, 2019 MINUTES**

**1. Call to Order**

Chair Krapf called the meeting to order at 7pm. Roll call was taken by Admin. Dawkins noting all were present except Mary Beth Guzzo.

**2. Review/Approve Minutes from May 1, 2019 and May 15, 2019.**

Moved by Ochsner, seconded by Moran Approved by unanimous voice vote.

**3. Review of Revised Draft Speed Control Policy**

Dawkins distributed the revised draft to the task force. Moran provided an overview of the updates, noting the new design and added language and credits. Statutory and code language would be cleaned up by the city attorney. There was a general discussion on clarification of some of the language in the draft between the task force and staff and what could still be revised and/or added. Dawkins offered to add a 'definitions an acronym' page, as well as page numbers, and a color-coded map. The final version would be available for approval at the May 30 meeting.

**4. Review/Discussion of Recommendations/Priorities to Present to City Council**

Dawkins explained her scoring system (based on rankings) for the priorities. Discussion on the biggest geographical areas of concern i.e. school and park zones, and the downtown shopping district was heard. Malusky suggested each member pick one or two priorities that are achievable. Krapf also noted their discussion on having a sub-committee of SPAC or standing committee after the recommendations have been presented. Members discussed how SPAC might be able to incorporate this group into a sub-committee and how inquiries and complaints would be handled. Dawkins and Maduzia suggested citizens continue to reach out to the Police Dept. for those concerns as they come up and perhaps a PD staff person could be a liaison for this new sub-committee.

After additional discussion, the following priorities were determined to be essential in bringing forward to City Council in June:

- 1) School/Park Zones (signage, crosswalk visibility, designating park zones, lighted stop signs at defined intersection)
- 2) Third Street (engineering study, cross-traffic signage)
- 3) Street Recommendations (evaluate classification of Fargo Blvd., Anderson Blvd. police presence and enforcement, East Side Drive police presence and enforcement)
- 4) Continue the Task Force (education campaign, participate in traffic complaint resolution)

The members verified their next meeting would be on Thursday, May 30, 2019 with recommendations to present at the June 3, 2019 City Council meeting.
